1.8. Superintendent Report - District Update - Karim Hachlaf

- Thank You to all schools for In-Person and Virtual Remembrance Day Ceremonies (Virtual at QB, 4 separate assemblies at NWSS)
- January 11, 2022 Discover New Westminster Schools Virtual Event Provides an opportunity to learn about different programs and offerings from
 K-12. More information on the District Website.
- Anti-Racism/Equity Consultant Report and data will be presented at the next board meeting.
- COVID-19 Update
 - 1100 employees in school district
 - o 50-100 employees (5-10%)
 - Had fewer than 5 cases that impacted adults
 - Currently having challenges with absenteeism; not enough TTOCs. Already having serious challenges filling absent teachers which would be compounded by a vaccine mandate
 - Our data for COVID cases shows very low case count
 - Less than 2.5% of staff affected
 - Unlike health-care we are not at the brink of the system breaking down.
 - District is using priority TTOCs to secure more staff, doing more recruitment (just received 10)
 - We have operating funds to acquire more teachers or priority TTOCs
 - Lack of replacement staff is the issue, but funding is not the issue in filling positions.

- Question: Is there a requirement for Teachers to disclose vaccination status to parents (Answer: No)
- Question: Possibility for a crossing guard at Merivale/Agnes
 (Answer: this question will go to the Transportation Manager, Mark and then back to principal)
- Question: How is it possible to project shortage when vaccination data is not known? (Answer: Projected shortage is NOT the sole reason for not proceeding with mandate)
